Dear Parents,



Zog is a star!


Zog earns his star for catching princesses. Can you help add stars to his star chart?




Dragon School Rules!

Gingerbread People

Ingredients (A grown up)

•350g/l2oz plain flour plus extra for rolling out

*I tsp bicarbonate of soda

•2 tsp ground ginger I tsp ground cinnamon

•125g/4½oz butter

•175g/6oz light soft brown sugar

•l egg

•4 tbsp golden syrup

To decorate - writing icing /cake decorations
(Colours that doctors/nurses /paramedic's might
wear.)

Talking Together - How to make your Gingerbread NHS

I. Sift together the flour, bicarbonate of soda, ginger and cinnamon and pour into the bowl. Add the butter and stir until the mix looks like breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar. (Use a food processor if you have one to make it easier.)

2. Lightly beat the egg and golden syrup together, add to the mixture until the mixture clumps together. Tip the dough out, knead briefly until smooth, wrap in cling film and leave to chill in the fridge for IS minutes.

 Preheat the oven to I80°C/I60°C Fan/Gas 4. Line two baking trays with greaseproof paper.

4. Roll the dough out to a 0.5cm/Kin thickness on a lightly floured surface. Using cutters, cut out the gingerbread people shapes and place on the baking tray, leaving a gap between them.

5. Bake for I2-I5 minutes, or until lightly golden-brown. Leave on the tray for IO minutes and then move to a wire rack to finish cooling. When cooled decorate with the writing icing. Who will you make?
