ALLERGIES AND ALLERGIC REACTIONS

The number of children with allergies are increasing year on year. In the BBC news today they discussed the risks of children having anaphylactic shock due to allergies. Recently a pupil in secondary school died due to his allergy to cheese (we do not have anyone allergic to cheese at our school).

Teaching and non-teaching staff had their annual training on our Inset day on Monday by the school nurse on how to spot signs of an allergic reaction and how to use an EpiPen. We have 16 First Aid trained staff to help your children. Please support us in being a nut free school so that we will not have to use our training to save a life.

Please do not bring Nut based products onto school premises at all. Not even at hometime. In our school we have children and staff allergic to nuts, seeds and milk. This means that a child with these allergies could have a potential allergic reaction and need life saving treatment. Often foods have 'hidden nuts' ie chocolate spread and some products ie kinder. Please remind your children not to share their packed lunches as there could be allergens in another child's packed lunch that may cause a reaction.

Please do not give your children nut based products for lunches ie seeded bread, chocolate biscuits, chocolate spread. We have reminded families about not bringing sweets or cakes for birthdays. Often nut products are put in with non-nut products for example snickers in Celebrations. We are also not always aware of nuts in cakes that are bought in.

If you would like to celebrate your child's birthday please bring in a book for the library and we celebrate their birthday in collective worship.



For those families that need an epiPen, please make sure they are in date, that we have 2 in school and the staff are aware of the allergies.

MUSIC—SPRING TERM 2020

If your child is interested in learning piano or recorder next term can you please let the office know by **Monday 11th November**. All lessons take place during the school day. Recorder is taught in groups of between 2-4 children (each child has the equivalent of 7.5 minutes per week) and is charged at £52.50 for the term (10 lessons). Children are taught the piano individually in weekly 15 minute lessons and cost £105.00 for the term (10 lessons).
