Beware of a new scam

A new telephone scam is coming to light callers contact residents saying they are from NHS Track & Trace, telling the resident that they have been in contact with someone suffering from Covid 19 & need to have a test sent out to them.

This is swiftly followed with a request for the resident's bank details; the caller states the test & results cost £500.

Please do not fall for this scam. If you need a test sent out to you because you are unable to attend a test site, this is done for free, both delivery & collection, followed up by the result

Important

The NHS Test and Trace service will NOT ask for bank details or payments ask for details of any other accounts, such as social media ask you to set up a password or PIN number over the phone ask you to call a premium rate number, such as those starting 09 or 087
