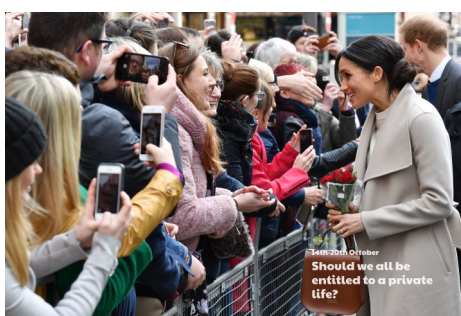
Second hand uniform sale £1 per item
