

Primary PE Premium Funding

Following the hugely successful 2012 Olympic and Paralympic games held in London, the government has allocated additional funding to improve the provision of PE and sport in primary schools.

In our school, we will receive approximately £8,890

For the year 2015/16 the grant will be spent:

- Funding a specialist PE teacher to deliver high quality teaching throughout KS2.
- Promoting links to the new Archer Academy (highly-resourced local secondary school with excellent PE facilities).
- Funding transport costs.
- Funding Change 4 Life clubs.
- New playground equipment.
- Training and developing Play Leader for lunchtimes/out of school clubs.
- Continued CPD for all teachers.
- Release time for current PE coordinator to support and develop new colleague in role.
- Special assemblies with visitors to celebrate The Rugby World Cup and Rio 2016.
- Introducing new cheerleading club.

Impact 2014/15

- Holy Trinity achieved the Gold Sainsbury's School Games Mark. This rewards the school for their commitment to and the development of competition, school sport and physical education.
- The school won the Barnet Small Schools Borough Athletics Competition.
- We finished second in the High 5 netball league.
- We finished second in the Barnet swimming gala.
- Participation in a range of sports including Tag Rugby and cheerleading.
- We qualified for the gymnastics championships at Chrystal Palace for the second year in a row.
- Our sporting excellence was mentioned in our Ofsted report (April 2015)

The promotion of sporting excellence has been a feature of the school for many years with notable successes in Barnet and London more widely, especially in gymnastics and swimming. In conjunction with the Barnet School Sports Partnership, the additional primary school physical education and sport funding has been used very effectively to provide further opportunities through professional coaches in particular. This is resulted in high numbers of pupils participating in sport, thus improving their health and well-being, and enabling many to excel.
