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COVID RESTRICTIONS AND EVENTS

We understand that the communication around Summer events in last week's newsletter has been disappointing to receive. We want to reassure parents that the decisions made have been in the interests of safety for all families.

Although the Government has produced some guidance for specific outdoor events, we are still bound by our own risk assessments and continually follow guidance from Barnet Local Authority until the end of term, including the last 3 days when restrictions may be lifted on 19th July. Risk assessments are specific to our school setting and the organisation of any events held. Unfortunately, the events we had planned did not meet the requirements of the risk assessments we have to operate by.

We also contacted a number of local schools, who had also had to make the same decision around Sports Day where parents are unfortunately unable to attend. However, every school is different, as the risk assessment applies to the logistics of their school environment and the organisation of specific events, which is why there may be some schools that are operating differently.

We understand that for Year 6 pupils, this is their last opportunity to experience any of the usual leavers' traditions or Holy Trinity events. With this in mind, we are looking at a way we can safely plan for an end of term event after 19th July for Year 6. We appreciate that this does not include events for other year groups, but we have made the decision to prioritise Year 6 to allow them to perform their production and leavers' assembly to parents after 19th July, as this is their last chance to take part in a Holy Trinity tradition. The risk assessment for one class bubble event is less restrictive than bringing the whole school together and can be more safely managed in line with our risk assessments.

We appreciate how difficult this year has been and we had hoped to plan for our usual Summer events. However, we have to follow the risk assessments in place. We hope for more normal times next year and events such as the HTSA Summer Event to take place in September, to bring our community together as we had hoped.

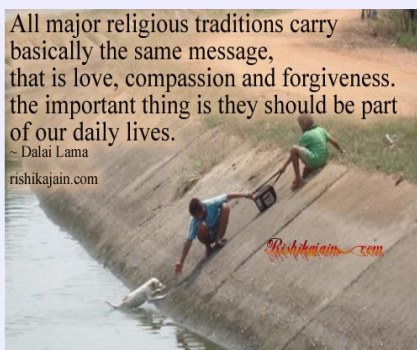
We appreciate your continued support in the operation of the school during these difficult times.
