SUMMER EVENT PLANS

As restrictions begin to ease and rates of infection decrease, we are provisionally planning our Summer events. We will be guided by the roadmap out of lockdown and the government guidance for schools but we are hopeful that after June 21st we are able to welcome more families back into the school grounds. This will hopefully enable us to run some of our much loved summer events. We hope to hold the following events, with some adaptations to keep children and families as safe as possible:



<u>KS1 & KS2 Sports Day</u> (date to be confirmed)- we will hold staggered times throughout the day for Year 1 & 2, Year 3 & 4 and Year 5 & 6 to take part in sporting activities. We are hopeful that parents /carers will be able to come onto the school field to watch their children participate in their sporting events.

<u>Thursday 14th - Y6 Production</u> - this year, Year 6 only will perform in the production. This is so we can arrange socially distanced seating in the hall for parents and carers of Year 6 pupils. Due to Covid restrictions for schools, we will not be able to mix the other class bubbles for the usual KS2 rehearsals and production.

<u>Monday 19th July - Summer Concert</u> - we hope to hold a whole school summer concert on the school field after school. Again, dependent on government guidance for schools.

<u>Wednesday 21st July - Y6 Leavers' assembly</u> - Year 6 parents will be invited into the school hall to watch their child's final assembly at Holy Trinity before moving on to secondary school. Once again, seating will be socially distanced.

All of the proposed plans will depend on government guidance for schools nearer the time. More details will be released when we have clearer guidance.

We are grateful that the staff have been able to create online versions of our usual school events, such as Harvest festival, KS1 Christmas production, Christingle service and Easter service. However, we are looking forward to welcoming parents back to watch some 'live' events in school and bring our community back together.


