From Monday we will have a sun safe rule - No Hat play in the Shade!


Please also remember to send your child in shoes/sandals which have closed in toes.

The omnibus fits 22 people. Three horses pulled it and children were used to sweep all of the poo up from the horses! The ride was bumpy and it was expensive.


### Horse tram:


